"Appoint a king to lead us, such as all the other nations have." (1 Samuel 8:5)

The Lord looks at our hearts

The Lord said to Samuel, 'Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.' (1 Samuel 16:7)

He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. (Isaiah 53:1-2)

But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities. (Isaiah 53:5)
