2 Kings 6: 1 – 23 Elisha Nature and Nations

- 1. A building project begins! 1 7
 - The impact of Elijah and Elisha A desire to serve God
 - The place where we meet with you is too small for us
 - A working party forms
 - A personal drama
 - A borrowed axe is lost. Iron a valuable commodity
 - A stick and a miracle
 - Elijah has a heart for people and a heart for God
- 2. A national crisis 8 15
 - The war with Aram continues
 - Elisha has spiritual insight into the King of Aram's plans
 - Who is the traitor Elisha the prophet in Israel
 - A war party is sent to Dothan to kill him
 - 'What shall we do?'
- 3. Looking beyond the seen world 16 17
 - Elisha knows God is protecting them
 - God needs to open our eyes to the reality of the unseen world
 - The army of king Aram cannot see them and advance
- 4. A miracle followed by mercy 18 23
 - Elisha asks the Lord to strike the army with blindness
 - Elisha leads them to Israel's capital Samaria
 - Shall I kill them my Father?
 - Give them a feast and send them back!

Digging Deeper

Read 2 Kings 6: 1 – 7

- 1. Do we expect the church in the UK to continue to decline in size and influence?
- 2. What do we learn from this series about the revival of God's people? What did it take for this change to take place?
- 3. How would you react to the problem of the lost axe head? How did Elisha? What might that say to us about how we exercise faith?
- 4. The miracle required the man to reach out and take the axe head as it floated. Why would Elisha do it this way?

Read 2 Kings 6: 8 – 15

- 1. There is a lot of comedy in this account of the King of Aram's attempt to attack Israel. Is this deliberate and what do we learn from this?
- 2. How did Elisha know that God was protecting him? Is this something only he as a prophet could see? What about us, are we aware of the unseen world around us?
- 3. Elisha prays that his servant's eyes would be open. Is this something we should be praying for one another?
- 4. How do we keep a Biblical balance between knowing there is an unseen world and seeing the unseen world everywhere?

Read 2 Kings 6: 16 – 23

- 1. The enemy still attacked Dothan and Elisha prays for a miracle. Is there any significance in asking for them to be blinded?
- 2. Elisha the primary reason for the attack leads them into Samaria. Israel's capital stronghold. What has happened in the Kings life that he asks Elisha what to do next?
- 3. What impact would Elisha's actions have had on the Arameans? Are acts of grace and mercy risky?
