Revelation – The Big Picture

Week four – an invitation to come and see...

The angel reveals the Big Picture to encourage a suffering church...

1. The invitation is given 4: 1

- A door standing open
- 'Come up here I will show you what must take place...'
- History from God's perspective vital truth for living in a broken world.

2. John is shown the throne room from which God rules 4: 2 - 6

- A dramatic scene lightning and thunder, 7 blazing lamps
- A rainbow God's covenant promise circles the throne
- 24 Elders dressed in white, crowns of Gold
- A sea of glass, clear as crystal

3. John looks to the centre 4: 6 - 11

- Four living creatures representing the whole of creation
- Creation reveals God's nature
 - i. Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord God Almighty!
 - ii. Eternal: 'Who was and is and is to come'
- Creation praises God and the 24 elders join in
 - i. You are worthy!
 - ii. Our being and purpose is found in God, nothing else
- Truth to encourage and help a church facing persecution for all who refused to worship the Roman Emperor.

4. John sees a scroll 5: 1 – 5

- The history and purpose of the world sealed with 7 seals!
- The scroll holds the answers to the world's great mysteries
- John weeps no-one can open the scroll
- One of the elders points to the Lion of the tribe of Judah!

5. John sees a lamb 5: 6 - 11

- Looking as if it had been killed. At the centre of the throne
- You are worthy! Jesus reveals the meaning and purpose of life and it is him!
- The scene closes in verse 12 14 with the whole of creation acknowledging and worshipping Jesus.

6. Come and See!

- Revelation is given to help and encourage a suffering church
 - i. When it is persecuted
 - ii. When it feels weak and ineffective
 - iii. When it is tempted to compromise
 - iv. When it is tempted to indifference
 - v. When tempted by pride and self-reliance
- Revelation is given to help individuals who make up the family of Jesus
- Revelation 1:17, 18 'Then I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. Then he placed his right hand on me and said: "Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last. I am the Living One; I was dead, and behold I am alive for ever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades.

- 2. John and we are invited to 'Come and See' In Revelation 4:1-11 what features come through most strongly in John's description?
- 3. How does the scene here compare with what is commonly regarded as worship? What might the reason for the differences be?
- 4. Revelation 5: 1 5 Why did the scroll cause grief for John? What does he then see in verses 6 14?
- 5. What is the central reality of the Universe according to the vision John was given?
- 6. How should we respond to knowing this?
 - A. Where have you seen God work his power through weakness?
 - B. What difference does this make when we face suffering, ridicule or persecution?
 - C. What does it mean to you that the Lamb still appears wounded even on the throne?
 - D. What does the suffering of the Lamb say about his love for you? What impact does this have on you?
